

BEES & CLIMATE SURVIVAL CHALLENGE



Bees are essential for food production and biodiversity, but climate change and pollution are threatening their survival. Your challenge is to take practical steps to support pollinators and reduce the impact of climate change on their habitats.

Duration: 1 week

Who Can Participate?

Individuals, families, or small groups

Where?

Your garden, balcony, local park, or schoolyard



How to Measure Impact?

1. Food for Bees (5 points): Left out fruit and checked for visits.
2. Water for Bees (5 points): Maintained a water station for at least 3 days.
3. Clean Habitat (5 points): Removed 5+ pieces of trash and protected bee areas.
4. Observation & Awareness (5 points): Counted at least 3 bees and shared information..

Help Bees Find Food (5 points)

Leave out a piece of fruit (e.g., banana, orange slice, or apple) in a garden, park, or balcony for pollinators.

Take a photo after 24 hours and see if bees or other insects visited.

Give Bees a Safe Water Spot (5 points)

Set up a bee water station using a shallow dish, small stones, and fresh water.

Refill and clean it at least 3 times during the week.

Protect Bee Habitats (5 points)

Pick up at least 5 pieces of trash in a garden, park, or near flowers where bees might feed.

Avoid stepping on wildflowers or disturbing natural bee-friendly areas.

Bee Watch & Awareness (5 points)

Observe and count at least 3 bees visiting a flower or water source.

Share one fact or action about protecting bees with a friend or on social media.
