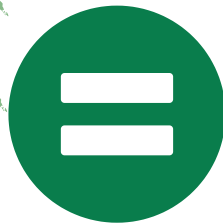


ORGANIC FOOD LABELS

Organic food labels in the EU are official stamps that show a product was made following strict organic rules. These labels make sure the food meets specific standards for how it's grown, processed, and labeled. They help us know that the food is better for the environment and free from harmful chemicals.

Some key facts about Organic Food Labels:

The EU Organic Label looks like a green leaf with 12 stars on it, representing the EU's commitment to organic farming.



To get the EU Organic Label, food must be made following strict rules that avoid harmful chemicals, pesticides, and GMOs (genetically modified organisms).

For a food product to be labeled organic, at least 95% of its ingredients must come from organic farming. The rest can be non-organic, but only in certain cases.

Organic farming also focuses on treating animals well, giving them space to roam and organic food to eat.



The EU Organic Label is the same across all EU countries, so if you see it, you know the product is organic, no matter where it's from.
